
## Usages of Japan Printed Regular Stamps "HURYO YUBIN", Mail to a Civilian Internee





## Jul. 25, 1944, First Class Postal Card Matter, Manila Circulating

Franked with a 5C regular stamp on a private postal card (overpaid 3C). This card was sent by a small boy to his father interned in Santo Tomas Internment Camp. Properly censored at the camp; the censor's personal chop "Kinoshita" is on the backside.


Scarce Usage:

Proper "Huryo Yubin" usages or inbound mails to civilian are rarely encountered.

## Copy of Backside (90%)

The message reads: MY DEAR DADDY / I AM EATING GOOD CHOW AND DRINKING MILK / EVERY DAY. I AM PRAYING TO GOD / THAT MY BIG DADDY IS / COMING BACK SOON. / SWEET KISSES / LEONARD

## **5C Usage of Registered Mail**



Jul. 19, 1943, Single First Class Registered mail, Atimonan, Tayabas to Manila Franked with three 5C regular stamps together with a 2C provisional stamp for proper 17C single first class registered mail rate.

Posted: Jul. 19, 1943 Atimonan, Tayabas

Transit: Jul. 22, 1943 San Pablo City (Registry marking of San Pablo City on verso)

Arrived: Jul. 23, 1943 Manila (marking of Registry Section, Manila on verso)

Traces of the Registry Return Receipt remains on verso.

**Scarce Postmark:** The Atimonan Registry Mark is rarely encountered.
