REGISTERED MAIL TO SPAIN

On October 8, 1897, A Spanish Royal Decree from Madrid prescribed new postal rates for the Philippines. The Decree was promulgated in Manila by issuance of Circular No. 13 by Administrator-General Ricardo Rey on November 9, 1897. The new rates became effective on January 1, 1898. Although the previous <u>registration fee</u> of 15 centavos per letter remained in effect, the <u>regular</u> postal rates changed from 10 centavos to 6 centavos for a single-weight letter to Spain, and so on, for each additional ½ once.

REGISTERED SINGLE-WEIGHT LETTER RATE TO SPAIN = 21 CENTAVOS (15 centavos registered fee + 6 centavos single-letter rate)

Only 3 Covers Known to Spain at this Rate



1898 Philippines to Barcelona, Spain posted at 20 centavos, short 1 centavos for the registered single-weight letter rate of 21 centavos.
