REGULAR ISSUES

A set of fourteen stamps were issued over six separate occasions between April 1, 1943 and April 10, 1944. The stamps were printed in Tokyo at the Naikaku Insatsu Kyoku (Cabinet Bureau of Printing). The stamps comprise four different designs, the dies for which were prepared by the following employees of the Bureau: Nipa Hut by Matsuura Masao; Girl Planting Rice by Kato Kurakichi; Mt Fuji and Mt Mayon Volcano by Noma Kenichi; and Moro Vinta by Watabe Fumio. Inscriptions on the top are Hito Yubin (Philippine Postage) and the bottom inscriptions are either sentabo (centavo) or peso.

Issued in plates of 400 stamps divided into four panes of 100 stamps (10 x 10). Plate imprints "Naikaku Insatsu Kyoku Seizo" (Printed by Cabinet Printing Bureau) appear on the bottom margin below position 98 in the same colour of the printed stamps.
